







### Springbok

Springbok Class have been learning about the countries of the world and the continents. We have enjoyed singing the continents song and thinking about places where we have all travelled. We have also learnt about Google Earth and have thought about how the images on Google Earth have been collected. We looked at local places of interest and also the local villages near to the school.

Year 1 and 2 have been creating their own sentences linked to the story of Lost and Found. We have now finished our story:

Once upon a time there was a penguin and the penguin was sitting on a little boy's doorstep. The boy was shocked when he opened the door. The penguin shuffled everywhere following him. The boy asked the duck if he knew where the penguin came from. The boy felt frustrated that he could not sleep. He ran down to the harbour and asked a big ship to take them to the South Pole. The ship's horn sounded like thunder. The boy found his boat in the wardrobe!

Year R have been thinking about time. We have learnt about the different seasons and have thought about the types of weather associated with different seasons. We have also created clocks and thought about the order of the months of the year. Year R have also learnt how to use the beebots and give directions using these. They enjoyed using the beebot floor mat and guiding the beebots to different places on the floor mat, thinking about the order of their instructions.

We enjoyed looking at the zoo cameras at Edinburgh Zoo. The children have been asking questions about the different animals and are aware that Yang Guang and Tian Tian the giant pandas will be travelling back to China this week after staying at Edinburgh Zoo for 12 years!

All of the children have also enjoyed learning about printing with Mrs Buckley. They thought about designs for a Christmas print and also enjoyed exploring printing resources in class! Year R have also enjoyed painting Christmas trees!









We also enjoyed Children in Need day, dressing in a variety of spots and designing a new look for Pudsey. See if you can spot some of our Battle of Britain themed ideas.



Useful items would be rice (long grain or microwaveable), tinned tomatoes, pasta sauce, soap, shower gel.



Attendance target set by the government = 96.6%

### **Holidays During Term Time**

All in-term holiday requests will be classed as unauthorised absences. This will likely result in a fixed penalty notice being issued from Norfolk County Council.

In Norfolk, penalty notices are issued in accordance with the Norfolk Local Protocol. In all cases a penalty notice can only be issued if the pupil has accrued at least 9 sessions (4.5 school days) of unauthorised absence within the previous 6 school weeks. This would result in a fine of £60 per child per parent ie; for a family with 2 children this would total £240
