#### Puffin

We have been super busy in Puffin Preschool over the past two weeks, our young explorers have been curious and creative whilst working collaboratively with one another.

We continued our All About Me topic, with a focus on emotions! It's been great to see the children recognise how themselves and others around them feel. Reading 'The Colour Monster' written by Anna



Llenas has been very engaging. Listening to the story of this cute but confused little Monsters journey encourages us to become emotionally aware whilst also reassuring us that it's okay to feel how we feel, even if it's a little bit mixed up and confused!

It is now coming to the end of International Space week but my word we have enjoyed every single second of it! Such a

wondrous topic has led to some incredible thoughts, questions and observations from our curious learners. We began our week on the red planet of Mars and

have ended it on the moon, we may have even seen some aliens along the way.

Our creative minds have been working hard at designing telescopes and rockets with a variety of materials.









I wonder what you can see if you look up at the sky when it turns dark tonight?!

This week we find ourselves talking about Autumn, even with the weather being as warm as it is there are many changes happening with the season transition! During our important circle time discussions the children have observed that in the mornings it's feeling chillier, and we may need to wear a coat or jacket now. On our walks around the school grounds we have also noticed that some leaves have been changing colour and may be falling to the ground. We look forward to looking deeper into Autumn and seeing what engaging activities we come across.

#### Springbok

We have been continuing our learning about the Oliver Jeffers book called The Way Back Home. We have continued to develop our understanding of using capital letters and full stops in our writing. We have started to develop our handwriting and have used the letter joins resources to help develop this.

All of the children in Springbok Class have been learning new sounds through our Monster Phonics scheme. We have also had a new architecture set arrive in Springbok Class which children have enjoyed using!

In P.E we have been pirates and have enjoyed following instructions! We were all amazed by the jets that flew over the school during our P.E lesson on the playground! Year R have also enjoyed using the bikes and trikes on the school playground each day.

Year R have been busy developing their drawing and observation skills, using materials such as chalk to record their ideas. Year 1 and 2 pupils enjoyed creating their own hot air balloon drawings and also learning about the different types of lines which can be used in art work. Year 1 and 2 have been continuing learning about gliders and also about the Wright Brothers and all of the hard work which they had to carry out to find a design that worked! We have linked the work of the Wright Brothers to our JONK characteristics and have realised that the Wright Brothers had to use all of our JONK values when they were creating their own flying machines.

We have also been practising our singing ready for our Harvest Festival. We have really enjoyed singing Cauliflowers Fluffy and look forward to seeing everyone at the Harvest Festival next week.

#### Vixen

These last few weeks, Vixen has been loving our art lessons. We've been learning a variety of techniques linked to sketching and watercolour.



Additionally, we created a picture inspired by the Battle of Britain. Many of us had so many exciting features: Spitfires, Messerschmitts, parachutes, plane trails and more.


With watercolours, we've experimented with creating different tones. We used


the three primary colours and demonstrated how to create lighter and darker tones with them. Vixen learnt that adding more water to watercolours will make the tone lighter. Using our new art skills, we created a similar picture of the Battle of Britain.

All of their artwork is absolutely incredible and I've been so impressed with their creativity and resilience when completing it.


In English, we have just started a new unit based on the book 'The Lion and the Unicorn'. To launch this unit, we had an experience lesson on what it was like to be an evacuee. We had to pack a suitcase with all the essential items. As well as this, we filled in our tag with all the information about who we are and where we are going.













#### Firefly

Firefly has continued to show amazing progress in their work this last fortnight.

In Maths we are now focussing on larger numbers, utilising our knowledge of place value to support rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

In our writing we have completed our non-chronological reports and have moved onto newspaper reports, inspired by The Blitz and events within "Goodnight Mister Tom" by Michelle Magorian. Firefly has made an amazing start with their catchy headlines!


For reading we explored "The Lion and the Unicorn".

In P.E. we have continued to build our football skills, looking at defending and stopping the ball to maintain possession. This made for some exciting 4v4 matches.

The Battle of Britain continues to be our topic theme for this half term. We are coming to the end of our exploration of technology that was available and utilised at the time. Over the last two weeks we have:

- Learned about The Dowding System and Chain Home, recreating it with the different roles involved.
- Learned about how Germany responded with the Knickebien system.
- Begun to create amazing artwork inspired by Robert Taylor.

#### Holidays During Term Time

All in-term holiday requests will be classed as unauthorised absences. This will likely result in a fixed penalty notice being issued from Norfolk County Council.

In Norfolk, penalty notices are issued in accordance with the Norfolk Local Protocol. In all cases a penalty notice can only be issued if the pupil has accrued at least 9 sessions (4.5 school days) of unauthorised absence within the previous 6 school weeks. This would be in a fine of £60 per child per parent ie; for a family with 2 children this would total
